

## Common questions

- **What if I make a mistake on the ballot?**
  - It happens. You can request a new ballot from the precinct worker.
- **If I need to, how do I file a complaint?**
  - First, ask for the chairperson of the election board at your polling place. There may be poll watchers near your polling place who might be able to assist you. You can also call your county clerk or file a complaint with the Wyoming Secretary of State.
- **What if someone tries to intimidate or harass me?**
  - Tell a poll worker. If a poll worker is the problem, tell a poll watcher, call your county clerk, or call the Secretary of State. Poll watchers are typically found outside a polling place.
- **What are provisional ballots?**
  - If you believe you are registered to vote and are in the correct polling place on Election Day, you may request a provisional ballot. This will be used to record a vote when there are questions about a given voter's eligibility.
  - After casting a provisional ballot, you have until close of business the day following the election to present documentation to the county clerk establishing your ability to register and vote in the district where you cast your provisional ballot.
  - Afterward, you will be sent a notice within 13 days if your ballot was counted or not counted. If it wasn't counted, you will be told the reason.

Please note. This brochure is a resource, not legal advice. It is provided for informational purposes only. Wyoming may revise its laws after this brochure is printed or published online.

## Quick tips

- Check your voter registration at least 30 days before the election.
- Locate your polling place and note the hours of operation.
- Consider voting early or absentee if possible. If you plan to vote at the polls, go in early in the day to avoid a last-minute rush.
- Read all instructions carefully.
- Ask for help if you need it.
- Take your time.

## Voter ID information

- Wyoming does not require photo ID for the purpose of voting. However, if you registered to vote by mail and are voting in a federal election for the first time, you must show a photo ID or another document that has both your name and residential address such as a current utility bill, a bank statement, or a paycheck.

## GENERAL VOTING INFORMATION

- **Basic requirements:** You must be 18 years old, a U.S. citizen, and a resident of Wyoming as well as a resident of the precinct in which you register.
- **Voting if you're attending college:** You can register to vote at your school address or your home address, whichever you consider your primary legal residence.
- **Voting with a criminal record:** First-time non-violent felons who have completed their supervision or were discharged from an institution on or after Jan. 1, 2010 automatically have their voting rights restored. Individuals who completed their sentence prior to Jan. 1, 2010, are required to apply for restoration of the right to vote.
  - If you qualify for automatic voting rights restoration, you will receive a signed certificate from the Wyoming Department of Corrections which indicates your voting rights have been restored. For additional information on the restoration of voting rights, contact the Department of Corrections at 307-777-6341.
- **Voting if you're experiencing homelessness:** You don't need a home to vote, but you must identify a place of residence (which can be a street corner, a park, a shelter, or any other place where you usually stay). You must also provide a mailing address, such as a shelter or advocacy organization, at which you can receive mail.
- **Voting rights and ADA requirements:** Call your county clerk right away and ask for accommodation or reassignment to an accessible polling place.
  - If you feel you cannot vote on the day of the election, fill out an absentee ballot application and mail it to your county clerk as soon as possible.
  - If you need help because of a physical disability or because you have difficulty reading or writing in English, tell a poll worker when you get to the polling place.
  - If you need instructions on how to use the voting equipment, ask a poll worker for help. Poll workers are required to help you any

time you ask – even after you have entered the voting booth.

- **Moving and address changes:**
  - If you moved or changed addresses within the same county, you should update your voter information with your county clerk's office prior to the election.
  - If you have not done so you will be required to update your information at your polling place before voting.
  - If you moved or changed addresses in a different county, you will need to re-register at your polling place before voting.

### Voter registration

- Register in person at your county clerk's office or by mail after printing off a registration form which can be located at [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).
- If registering by mail, fill out the form, sign it, and then get it notarized prior to submitting it to your county auditor. This requirement is waived if you are in the military or live overseas.
- Voter registration closes two weeks prior to an election. However, you may still register and vote absentee at the same time within that two-week period or at the polls on Election Day. Registration during this time can be accomplished in two ways.
  - Register and vote simultaneously at either your county clerk's office or an absentee polling place.
  - Register via mail and include a request for an absentee ballot. Both the voter registration form and the absentee ballot form are available at [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).
- If you end up registering to vote on Election Day, you must bring acceptable identification such as:
  - A Wyoming driver's license
  - United States passport or state-issued ID
  - A tribal ID of any federally recognized Tribe
  - ID issued by a Wyoming university or school.
  - United States Military Card
  - ID issued to a dependent of a member of the United States Armed Forces

- **Confirming voter registration:** You can confirm your voter registration by calling your county clerk's office or check [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).

### Voting on Election Day

- **Election Day 2020:** Tues., Nov. 3, 2020.
- Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
  - You have the right to vote if you're in line or inside your polling place when the polls close.
- **Getting time off work:** If your work schedule would make it impossible for you to vote in-person while the polls are open, your employer is required to give you time off to vote, without penalty or deduction in your wages. Your employer has the right to specify which hours you get to take.
- **Find your polling place:** On Election Day, you must vote at your assigned polling place.
  - Find yours at the Wyoming Secretary of State's website: [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).

### Absentee voting

- If you feel you cannot vote on the day of the election, fill out an absentee ballot application and return it to your county clerk as soon as possible.
- In order for your vote to be counted, absentee ballots must be received in the county clerk's office no later than 7 p.m. on Election Day. Ballots arriving after the deadline won't be counted.
  - Bring your completed absentee ballot in the signed envelope to your county clerk's office.
  - Mail your completed absentee ballot in the provided envelope to your county clerk's office. Please note that mail delivery within the county may take up to seven days, and longer if you're mailing your ballot from outside the county.

## Preguntas Comunes

- **¿Qué pasa si cometo un error en la boleta?**
  - Sucede. Puede solicitar una nueva boleta al trabajador del distrito.
- **Si es necesario. ¿Cómo presento una queja?**
  - Primero pregunte por el residente de la junta electoral en su lugar de votación. Puede haber observadores de encuestas cerca de su lugar de votación que podrían ayudarle. También puede llamar a su secretario del condado o presentar una queja ante el Secretario de Estado de Wyoming.
- **¿Qué pasa si alguien intenta intimidarme o acosarme?**
  - Informe al trabajador electoral. Si el problema viene de un trabajador electoral, informe al observador de votos, llame a su secretario del condado o llame a su secretario del condado o llame al Secretario de Estado. Por lo general, los observadores de encuestas se encuentran fuera de un lugar de votación.
- **¿Qué son las boletas provisionales?**
  - Si cree que está registrado para votar y está en el lugar de votación correcto el día de las elecciones, puede solicitar una boleta provisional. Esto se utilizará para registrar una votación cuando haya preguntas sobre la elegibilidad de un votante determinado
  - Después de emitir una boleta provisional, tiene hasta el cierre del día siguiente a la elección para presentar documentación al secretario del condado que establezca su capacidad para registrarse y votar en el distrito donde emitió su boleta provisional.
  - Después, se le enviará un aviso dentro de los 13 días si su boleta fue contada o no fue contada. Si no se contó, le dirán la razón.

Por favor, tenga en cuenta que este folleto es un recurso, no un consejo legal. Se proporciona únicamente con fines informativos. Wyoming puede actualizar sus leyes después de que este folleto se imprima o sea publicado en línea.

## Consejos Rápidos

- Verifique su registro de votante al menos 30 días antes de las elecciones.
- Ubique su lugar de votación y anote el horario de atención.
- Considere votar temprano o en ausencia si es posible.
- Si planea votar en las urnas, vaya temprano en el día para evitar las prisas de última hora.
- Lea todas las instrucciones detenidamente.
- Pida ayuda si necesita.
- Tome su tiempo.

- **Conviértase un trabajador de la comisaría:** Los trabajadores del distrito son jugadores clave en la gestión de los lugares de votación el día de las elecciones. Este puesto pagado es reclutado por su Auditor del Condado.

## Información de Identificación del Votante

- Wyoming no requiere identificación con foto para el propósito de votar. Sin embargo, si se registró para votar por correo y está votando en una elección federal por primera vez, debe mostrar una identificación con foto u otro documento que tenga su nombre y dirección residencial, como una factura de servicios públicos actual, estado de cuenta bancaria o un cheque.
- Si usted es un ciudadano naturalizado y tiene problemas para votar el día de las elecciones o antes del día de las elecciones debido a que su estatus de ciudadanía no puede ser confirmado, comuníquese con nosotros enviando a un correo electrónico a [acluwy@aclu.org](mailto:acluwy@aclu.org) o llamando al 307-316-4936.

## INFORMACIÓN GENERAL SOBRE LA VOTACIÓN

- **Requisitos Básicos:** Debe tener 18 años, ser ciudadano estadounidense y residente de Wyoming, así como residente del distrito en el que se registra.
- **Votar mientras asiste a la universidad:** Puede registrarse para votar en su dirección de la escuela o en su domicilio, independientemente de lo que considere su residencia legal principal.
- **Votar con antecedentes penales:** Criminales por primera ofensa no violenta que completaron su supervisión o han sido dados de alta de una institución el 1 de Enero de 2010 o después automáticamente se restauran sus derechos para votar. Las personas que completaron su sentencia antes del 1 de enero de 2010, están obligadas a solicitar la restauración del derecho a votar.
  - Si califica para la restauración automática de los derechos de voto, recibirá un certificado firmado por el Departamento de Correcciones de Wyoming que indica que su derecho para votar ha sido restaurado. Para obtener más información adicional sobre la restauración del derecho a votar, comuníquese con el Departamento de Correcciones al 307-777-6341.
- **Votar si se encuentra en estado de indigencia:** No necesita una casa para votar, pero debe identificar un lugar de residencia que puede ser una esquina de la calle, un parque, un refugio o cualquier otro lugar donde te quedas usualmente. También debe proporcionar una dirección postal, como un refugio o una organización de defensa, en la que puede recibir correo.
- **Derechos de voto y Requisitos de votación y ADA:** Llame inmediatamente al secretario de su condado y solicite alojamiento o reasignación a un lugar de votación accesible.
  - Si cree que no puede votar el día de la elección, complete una solicitud de boleta de voto ausente y envíela por correo al funcionario electoral de su condado lo antes posible.
  - Si necesita ayuda en la cabina de votación debido a una discapacidad física o porque tiene dificultades para leer o escribir en inglés, dígaselo a un trabajador cuando llegue al lugar de votación.
  - Si necesita instrucciones sobre cómo usar el equipo de votación, pida ayuda a un trabajador electoral. Los trabajadores electorales están obligados a ayudarlo en el momento que usted lo pida aun después de haber entrado a la cabina de votación.

- **Mudanza y cambios de dirección:**
  - Si se mudó o cambió de dirección dentro del mismo condado, debe de actualizar su información de votante oficina del secretario de su condado antes de la elección.
  - Si no lo ha hecho, se le pedirá que actualice su información en su lugar de votación antes de votar.
  - Si se mudó o cambió de dirección en un condado diferente, deberá volver a registrarse en su lugar de votación antes de votar.

## Registro de votantes

- Regístrese en persona en la oficina del secretario de su condado o por correo después de imprimir un formulario de registro que se puede encontrar en [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).
- Si lo presenta nuevamente por correo, complete el formulario, firmelo y después notarielo antes de enviarlo al auditor de su condado. Este requisito no se aplica si está en el ejército o vive en el extranjero
- El registro de votantes se cierra dos semanas antes de una elección. Sin embargo, aún puede registrarse y votar en ausencia al mismo tiempo dentro de ese período de dos semanas o en las urnas el día de las elecciones. El registro durante este tiempo se puede realizar de dos formas.
  - Regístrese y vote simultáneamente en la oficina del secretario de su condado o en un lugar de votación ausente.
  - Regístrese por correo e incluya una solicitud para una boleta de voto en ausencia. Tanto el formulario de registro de votante como el formulario de boleta de voto ausente están disponibles en [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).
- Si termina registrándose para votar el día de las elecciones, debe traer una identificación aceptable como:
  - Licencia de conducir de Wyoming
  - Pasaporte de los Estados Unidos o identificación emitida por el estado
  - Una identificación tribal de cualquier tribu reconocida a nivel federal
  - Identificación emitida por una universidad de Wyoming o colegio.
  - Tarjeta militar de los Estados Unidos
  - Identificación emitida a un dependiente de un miembro de la Fuerzas Armadas de Estados Unidos
- **Confirmación del registro de votante:** Puede confirmar su registro de votante llamando a la oficina del secretario de su condado o visitando [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).

## Votación el día de las elecciones

- **Día de las elecciones 2020:** martes 3 de noviembre de 2020.
- Las urnas están abiertas de 7 a.m. a 7 p.m.
  - Tiene derecho a votar si está en la fila o dentro de su lugar de votación cuando cierran las urnas
- **Obtener tiempo libre del trabajo:** Si su horario de trabajo le imposibilita votar en persona mientras las urnas están abiertas, su empleador debe darle tiempo libre para votar, sin penalización ni deducción de su salario. Su empleador tiene derecho a especificar qué horas puede tomar.
- **Encuentre su lugar de votación:** El día de las elecciones, debe votar en su lugar de votación asignado
  - Encuentre el suyo en el sitio web de la Secretaría del estado de Wyoming en [sos.wyo.gov](http://sos.wyo.gov).

## Voto en ausencia

- Si siente que no puede votar el día de la elección, llene una solicitud de boleta de voto ausente y devuélvala al secretario de su condado lo antes posible.
- Para que se cuente su voto, las boletas de voto ausente deben recibirse en la oficina del secretario del condado a más tardar a las 7 p.m. el día de las elecciones. Las papeletas que lleguen después de la fecha límite no se contarán.
  - Lleve su boleta de voto ausente completada en el sobre firmado a la oficina del secretario de su condado.
  - Envíe por correo su boleta completa de votación en ausencia en el sobre provisto a la oficina del secretario de su condado. Tenga en cuenta que la entrega por correo dentro del condado puede demorar hasta siete días, y más si envía su boleta desde fuera del condado.

# Wyoming Voter Registration Application Form Instructions

**Where can I register to vote?**  
At your local County Clerk's Office, by mail, or at the polls on Election Day.

**What documents do I need to bring with me to the Clerk's office?**  
**Present a valid Wyoming driver's license.** (If you do not have your current valid driver's license with you, you must provide the number along with additional acceptable identification as noted in the table below.)  
**If you have not been issued a Wyoming driver's license or yours is expired, you must provide:**

- ✓ A statement to that effect;
- ✓ The last four digits of your social security number; and
- ✓ Acceptable identification as noted in the table below.

**If you have neither a valid Wyoming driver's license nor a social security number,** please indicate this by checking the appropriate box on the Voter Registration Application form and contact your County Clerk.

**What do I need if I decide to mail in the application?**  
If you are mailing the voter registration application in, you will need:

- ✓ To complete the form and sign the oath before an oath-taking officer\*;
- ✓ To include a (scanned) paper copy of the identification shown to the oath-taking officer; and
- ✓ Mail the form and printed copy of your identification directly to your local County Clerk's office.

**What are the deadlines to register?**  
Voter registration closes two weeks prior to an election. However, you may still register and vote absentee at the same time within that two week period or at the polls on Election Day.

## MEET YOUR CANDIDATES

Meeting your candidates in person or over video call can be an effective way to build a relationship so they can understand what matters to their constituents.

It's most helpful to determine prior to the meeting what you hope to get out of the interaction. Whether that be an official position on an issue you care about, or an answer to a statement they made publicly. Whatever it is, remember to map it out and plan out your follow up.
