





#### Why we verify?

When a call to the Hotline comes in a dispatcher will send several of our trained volunteers to go to the site and document what is happening.

If it's not an immigration raid, we dispel rumors and calm fears in the community.

# And there's a broader purpose:

Often, even well-meaning city officials are unaware of ICE activity occurring in their cities. For example, earlier this year, Denver officials believed that ICE was not detaining anyone in local courthouses. When proof of ICE activity was presented to those officials, it created the space for dialogue based on facts - and resulted in Denver's new Public Safety Enforcement Priorities Act.

This Act prohibits certain kinds of unconstitutional ICE activities and promotes community trust, so that all people, regardless of immigration status, will feel safe in going to school, reporting crimes, and accessing public health and human service programs, among other

things. In addition, in 2013, CO repealed Colorado's "show me your papers" law as a result of all those who shared their stories.
